## Connecticut MATCH-ADTC Clinician Certification Criteria


The Child Health and Development Institute, along with the Department of Children and Families and Harvard University, has developed a MATCH-ADTC clinician certification process to distinguish Connecticut clinicians who have successfully completed MATCH training and implementation requirements.

## **Eligibility**

Clinicians and/or clinical supervisors who have participated in MATCH-ADTC clinical training, including those participating in a Learning Collaborative<sup>1</sup>.

## **Process**

The Child Health and Development Institute will administer Connecticut clinician certifications in MATCH-ADTC in collaboration with Harvard University. Case completion data collected in EBP Tracker will be analyzed biannually, for the terms: January – June and July – December, for active clinicians who have successfully completed training and clinical consultation requirements.
